Established in 1992, the Ohio Library and Information Network (OhioLINK) is Ohio's statewide academic library consortium, serving [88 Ohio institutions](#) plus the State Library of Ohio. Delivering IT infrastructure and shared digital resources, OhioLINK provides higher education students and faculty with access to valuable digital research and teaching materials at a fraction of the cost if those collections had to be purchased by individual institutions.

OhioLINK connects library services, print and digital collections among its member institutions and manages collaborative services aimed at reducing students' cost of higher education in Ohio. Together, OhioLINK members fund, build, and sustain these shared services.
