Established in 1992, the Ohio Library and Information Network (OhioLINK) is Ohio's statewide academic library consortium, serving [86 Ohio institutions](#) plus the State Library of Ohio. Delivering both IT infrastructure and content negotiation, OhioLINK provides students, researchers, faculty, and staff with access to valuable digital research collections at a fraction of the cost if those collections had to be purchased by individual institutions.

OhioLINK also connects library services, print and digital collections among its member institutions and manages collaborative services aimed at reducing students' cost of higher education in Ohio, including [eTutoring](#) and [Affordable Learning](#).
