Six ways to get started, right now

1. Go to your library.

OhioLINK provides a wealth of resources; your library may have more. Go to the library's web site, or visit the brick-and-mortar library. **Bonus:** librarians are on site and want to help you. Just ask!

2. Library closed? Download articles instantly.

Quickly search across multiple subject areas using the Electronic Journal Center.

3. Find subject-specific research.

databases.ohiolink.edu

Choose from more than 150 research databases to find articles in a specific subject area.

4. Get materials fast.

catalog.ohiolink.edu

Search other Ohio libraries via the OhioLINK Library Catalog. Request books, periodicals, maps, music scores and audiovisual materials. Pick them up at any OhioLINK member library.

5. Access electronic books.

ebooks.ohiolink.edu


OhioLINK's collection of 200,000 eBooks includes encyclopedias, dictionaries, and computer and technology titles.

6. Locate sources.

The ETD Center contains electronic theses and dissertations from students at participating Ohio colleges and universities. Go here to find work in your subject area.





Additional Tips

Off campus access

- You will be prompted for your campus ID information to access some resources.
- Contact your library if you have any questions, do not know your ID information or are having problems logging in.

Use advanced search options

- You can make searches more effective by using advanced search options.
- For assistance, ask your librarian or use the database's help function.

Renew often and return on time!

- Renew materials up via your library's website, unless another user has requested them.
- Fines are charged for overdue OhioLINK books and library materials—return or renew on time!
