What does OhioLINK offer all citizens and students? Tens of millions of high quality academic and scholarly books, eBooks, eJournals, and databases.

How?

Over 40 million print books:

- Sign up for a State Library of Ohio card to borrow OhioLINK circulating print materials. For more information, consult the State Library website at **library.ohio.gov**.
- If your local public library is a member of SearchOhio, you can borrow OhioLINK print materials. Check with your library to see if they are a member or look for the Search OhioLINK button in your public library catalog.
- Ask your closest OhioLINK institution library about a community membership. Many member libraries, especially public institutions, offer this for a nominal fee.

Databases, eJournals and other digital materials:

- Visit an OhioLINK library in person. You can use OhioLINK digital materials such as eJournals and databases on site while in the library. Call your nearest OhioLINK institution to check for more information; see the web at ohiolink.edu/members.
- Any Ohio resident can also access OhioLINK digital materials such as eJournals and databases on site at the State Library of Ohio.

Ohio college students, faculty and staff can access OhioLINK materials in person and remotely via their institutional libraries.

Libraries Connect Ohio


